Marion Township Public Participation at Township Board Meetings Policy

The Public shall be given an opportunity to be heard at every Township Board Meeting following this Policy adopted by the Township Board.

The Township Supervisor is the moderator of the meeting. In the absence of the Supervisor, the Township Clerk shall hold an election of the Board Members present to select a moderator for the meeting.

Anyone attending the meeting either in-person or on-line may speak during the "Call to the Public" part of the meeting. To preserve order, those attending in-person will speak first. When all in-person attendees have been heard, the moderator will ask if any on-line attendee wishes to speak.

When recognized by the moderator, in-person attendees shall come to the podium. The moderator will request that they give their name and address before they begin their comments.

When all in-person attendees have finished speaking, the moderator will ask if anyone attending the meeting on-line wishes to speak. On-line attendees may unmute themselves and when recognized by the moderator may speak. On-line attendees will also be asked for their name and address.

All comments shall be addressed to the Township Board. The "Call to the Public" is for attendees to provide information or opinions to the Township Board and is not intended to be a dialog. Anyone needing a response should contact officials or staff during working hours.

To preserve efficiency, speakers will be asked to keep their comments to three minutes or less.

On some occasions, attendees may be asked for comments during agenda items.

PLANNING COMMISSION APPOINTMENT

Bill Fenton said he interviewed six candidates for the opening and recommended Joe Mazur to fill the position. Jim Witkowski motioned to accept the recommendation to appoint Joe Mazur to the Planning Commission. Motion failed due to lack of second.

Discussion: Scott Lloyd asked why the other board members were not shown the applications of the other candidates. Bill Fenton said because the supervisor is responsible for making the nomination. The board members would like to see resumes of all candidates.

CORRESPONDENCE & UPDATES

Dan Lowe said the area around the sewer line to the pump station is overgrown and needs to be cut down. He will check with MHOG to see if they can do it.

Les Andersen said Iosco Township paid for ditch and gravel work on Dutcher Road.

Tammy Beal said there are two voting precincts in the basement and would like to put in cement stops/posts in front of the windows for security. There is a \$5,000 security grant she would like to look into. She also asked Jim Witkowski, Scott Lloyd, and Dan Lowe if they would be willing to put early voting signs in their yards.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Joe Mazur thanked the board for their consideration and asked the board members what exactly they are looking for in a Planning Commissioner; it would be helpful if the applicants knew. He also said at the last meeting, there was discussion of an overcharge by a family member; he feels it should be approved by three board members or put out for bids.

Director Tim Church requested time to discuss the budget at 5:30 pm before the regular board meeting on November 17, 2026 and an earlier time for a work session at 5:30 pm for the December 15, 2026 meeting to discuss the future millage request.

The motion to adjust both meeting times was made by Treasurer Tammy Beal and seconded by Trustee Sue Daus.

Motion carried 5-0.

Parks and Recreation Month is being called "Power of Parks and Recreation."

The Melon Ball social event will be held at the Howell Opera House on Saturday, August 8, 2026 from 6-10 pm.

The Maintenance report in regard to the Oceola grounds is they are at the completion stage. The fields are good and the sprinklers are working. The pickleball courts are almost finished being painted. The benches will be placed and the grand opening is coming soon. Genoa Township will have the upper parking lot repaved soon. There was discussion of using artificial turf in the highly used areas due to the constant wear on the grass on the soccer fields.

Director Tim Church has discussed with Sally, the consultant, about having more organized reporting of the patron experience including the strength of the faculty and grounds, sustainability, accountability and development of partnerships in the community to help build the program. The United Way did award a grant for \$7800 for afterschool meals for the teen center and a wellness program that would include fitness classes.

"Hello Howell" will be held at Cleary University on September 14, 2026 from 6-8 pm at the Johnson Center. This event will include round table discussions with staff to collect information from the public about their needs and desires from HAPRA. It will be titled "Belonging by Design" with a broad age range and offer interactive feedback.

Board Member Reports

Chair Nick Hertrich from the City of Howell said the summer has been great downtown. The "Fire & Ice" project is almost completed with a July 13, 2026 ribbon cutting planned. The Bennett Center lease is being looked at and the desire is to have all parties satisfied.

Vice Chair Terry Philibeck from Oceola discussed the round a bout at Eager and Golf Club.

Treasurer Tammy Beal said that about 100 people attended the opening of the Marion Township pickleball courts. The asphalt for the parking lot has been approved. The new inclusive playground equipment with the partnership from HAPRA should arrive in September.

Secretary Candie Hovarter from Genoa said they were working into the evening on the asphalt for the parking lot. The Burrough's, Chilson Road, owners had requested live entertainment along with other things at the Planning Commission meeting and were not granted permission.

Trustee Sue Daus from Howell Township said there was nothing new in Howell Township.

Board members; our resident at 1051 Tracilee is having to switch over to city sewer due to a failing field.

With the Township special funding no longer being available, the homeowner has researched other funding options to have it repaired as required.

At this time the homeowner is exploring SRLP program, (septic replacement loan program) managed through the State of Michigan.

These loans have a much lower interest rate with this one being 1%

If she takes this loan, funds would not be paid until the work has been completed.

At this time, they are requesting the REU to be approved and the cost to be paid at the time of completion.

I have contacted the state and have verified that this is in fact all true.

They did state that the full payment would be paid to the contractor (Bowman Construction), included the \$9,000 REU cost. Marshall Bowman has stated he will be ok with signing off that the payment will be made to the township after loan is fulfilled.
